


- "Violent Crime"



# **EPD** Response

- Gang Response, Anti-Crime Units
- All Unlawful Possession of Firearm (UPF) cases are being assigned to an investigator
- All UPF cases to one prosecutor
- Exceptional bail requests risk to community safety
- Extreme Risk Protection Orders
- National Integrated Ballistic Information Network

# Challenges

- Stolen guns on the rise
- Notable increase in number of individuals contacted armed with guns
- Drugs
- Drug trafficking firearms
- Court backlogs
- Repeat offenders, court releases
- Staffing issues operating at 25%-50%


# Strategy

- Continue to staff Anti-Crime and Gang Response Units as long as possible

- Regional violent crime collaboration
- Guns for gift cards





# Community Concerns in 2022

Results from SPIDRTech Survey



At the time these numbers were collected, there were 4,029 survey respondents.

# EPD response

- More than 1,700 COET contacts (Jan-July, 2022)
- 12 LEAD referrals
- 18 clients to inpatient treatment, 26 to diversion center
- 31 clients placed in motels
- Over 35 clients placed in pallet shelters
- 80 arrests
- Special operations (Drug TF, SCSO & EPD)

# Challenges

- Fentanyl
- State law
- Lack of treatment/detox/housing
- Lack of coordination among service providers (secondary impacts)
- Staffing issues (service providers, police)



# Strategy

- Continue to staff COET
- Continue special operations
- Advocate for more timely access to treatment, shelter, resources
- Advocate for an effective fix to the Blake decision
- Alternate response, 988
- Advocate for accountability throughout criminal justice system

# Accountability

- < Accountability leads to > in crime
- Accountability throughout the CJ system
- Law enforcement, prosecutors, judges, legislators
- All stakeholders must maintain accountability, or result will lead to increase crime and public safety issues
- Regional Mayors Public Safety Initiative Update
